Use ½ ounce Oxy-d per gallon of water. No rinse required.

For general cleaning, including floors and carpet extraction:

Use 1-2 ounces Oxy-d per gallon of water. Will not harm floor finish at this dilution. No rinse required. For carpets test an inconspicuous area for color-fastness. Do not use on wool rugs.

For carpet spotting and extraction pre-spray: Use 1-2 ounces Oxy-d per gallon of water. Do not use on wool rugs.

For heavy soil, spray and wipe cleaning and routine tile and grout cleaning:

Use 5-6 ounces Oxy-d per gallon of water.
